Learning Knights:

At Pevensey and Westham School we aim to help the children to become independent learners. We believe that the children can excel in all areas of the curriculum by developing their learning skills. Each Learning Knight teaches the children a key skill which will help them to take responsibility for their learning and to overcome any barriers and challenges to their progress and achievement. The perfect learner will embody all four of these knights and we have recently appointed our Learning Knight Leaders as part of our pupil leadership roles to help us to support all of the children in our school to become excellent learners!

School Houses: We have 4 school houses in our school: **Normans (Red)** **Romans (Blue)** **Saxons (Green)** and **Vikings (Yellow)**. The children can earn house points for their house and receive rewards and acknowledgement throughout the year.

Uniform List

All children are required to wear full school uniform. The school colours are red, and the essential uniform list is as follows:

Red School Jumper or Cardigan (purchase from school only)
PE T Shirts (available in the 4 house colours Red, Green, Yellow, Blue) (purchase from school only)
PE Bag (available in the 4 house colours Red, Green, Yellow, Blue) (purchase from school only)
White polo shirts (at least one must have the school logo)
Black/Grey school trousers/skirt/pinafore dress (skirts must be knee length)
Black/Grey Socks/Tights
Black leather type school shoes (no trainers, sandals or plimsolls)
Black PE shorts/tracksuit bottoms
Black plimsolls for PE
Water Bottle (one bottle per child is provided free)
In summer red checked summer dresses can be worn.

Optional:

White Logo Polo Shirt (purchase from school only)
Red Fleece (purchase from school only)
Red Summer Cap (purchase from school only)
Book Bag (strongly recommended for all pupils from Foundation Stage to Year 2) (purchase from school only)

Please make sure your child has a coat in colder weather, and a sun hat in the warmer months.

School Day

The main school gate is located at the end of the drive next to St Marys Church, this is open from 8.30-9.00 and 14:55-15:15. If you need to come into the school outside of these times please come to the school office. A member of staff will be available on the playground every morning.

Mornings:

Classroom doors are open at 08:40, children are to be in class ready for registration by 08.45 (in Foundation the doors are open from 08.45 - 08:55)

All teachers are available in their classrooms at the beginning of the school day to welcome the children and get them settled in to their morning learning. Children (except Foundation Stage) are encouraged to say goodbye in the playground and take themselves into school. Any urgent messages can be relayed to class teachers via a member of the leadership team on duty in the playground, or a member of the office team.

Break:

Children may have water and a healthy snack (ideally a piece of fruit) at morning break. Children in Foundation Stage – Year 2 are provided with a piece of free fruit or vegetable every day.

Milk: Children under the age of 5 are entitled to free milk, this is provided at break times, if you would like your child to continue to have milk you can register at www.coolmilk.com.

Collective Worship:

The act of collective worship at Pevensey and Westham CE School fosters a sense of community and fellowship by bringing pupils together to draw on the life and shared values of our school and of the wider community. This is why we encourage children to lead and participate. We base our Collective worship on values which reflect Christian beliefs, once a week we hold worship in St Mary's Church. We aim to foster a sense of wonder and give time for reflection on spiritual and moral issues. We sing worship songs and provide times when children can celebrate school life and their achievements. Visitors to the school are encouraged and parents and friends are welcomed at different times of year to join the children in Collective Worship.



Lunch time:

Your child can choose to bring a packed lunch from home or have a hot meal, cooked fresh on site every day. School dinners cost £2.10, pupils in Year R-2 are entitled to universal free school meals. Dinners must be paid and booked in advance using Parentmail. For the latest menu click [here](#). **Free School Meals:**

If you are in receipt of benefit you may be entitled to pupil premium, meaning your child will get free school meals, one set of uniform from our uniform shop (this includes Jumper/Cardigan, polo shirt, PE t shirt, book bag and PE bag), no cash substitute will be given, and as a school we will be given extra funding. This is used by us to support individuals and help with your child's education. If you think you are eligible please fill in a [form](#).

End of the day:

The school day ends at 15:00, your child will be handed over at the appropriate door by a member of staff. Please collect your child promptly, if an unexpected situation arises and you will be late collecting, please ring the school office.

Health, Illness & Absence:

Medicines: If your child is prescribed medicine that is required 4 times a day, then we can administer a dose at school, please fill in a medicine form and hand the medicine in directly to the office, we cannot administer non-prescription medication such as Calpol.

Illness: If your child is absent from school through illness, please either call the absence line on 01323 465175, or inform us using the 'Notify Absence' tool on Parentmail before 09:15. If your child is unwell with diarrhoea or vomiting we request they be kept at home for 24 hours after the last episode.

Absence: Any parent requesting leave of absence for their child will be required to fill in an Absence Request form, these are available at the school office. Please complete and return to the school office, giving as much notice as possible.

Appointments & requests to leave early: Please attempt to make all appointments outside of the school day or in school holidays. Where this is not possible please inform the office, you may be asked to produce proof of such appointments.

Accidents & first aid: Minor accidents will be dealt with by a trained first aider and recorded in the accident book. Bumps to the head will be notified with a 'bumped head sticker' and 'bumped head note'. If we have any concerns for a child's health or well-being we will contact you. Please make sure we have up to date contact details for you.

Classrooms and Staff

Communication: Parentmail, Class Dojo, and Tapestry (EYFS only)

Parentmail: You can download an app for Apple & Android devices, or access via the web: <https://pmx.parentmail.co.uk> You will have one account where you will receive information, newsletters, details of trips, book parents evenings, pay for trips, pay for school dinners, notify absences and purchase uniform, etc.

Class Dojo: There is also an app for the Class Dojo, or you can access via the web: www.classdojo.com The Class Dojo is used by the class teacher to communicate more informally with parents, the Class Story part of this updates you on what has happened in class each week. House points are also recorded on Class Dojo so you can celebrate your child's success on a daily basis.

Tapestry: Tapestry is used by the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) only, it is an online learning journey, used to assess your child and share their progress with you. You will be given login details and a password shortly after your child starts school.

Calendar & Events: The school calendar is available on the website and is regularly updated. You will be notified of events via Parentmail and Class Dojo.

Policies: All of our school policies and documents are available to view on our website under 'About Us', alternatively you can request a paper copy from the office.

Curriculum:

At Pevensey and Westham CE Primary School, we use 4 Cornerstones to structure our termly learning. The first corner is 'Engage' where we immerse the children in their new learning and find out what they already know and what they need to learn. We then 'Develop' a wide range of skills using exciting learning opportunities.

Pupils have the opportunity to apply their new learning in the 'Innovate' phase and then they reflect on their learning during their final 'Express' event. Curriculum
